# Consumer, FMCG & Retail



# Overview

Fast-Moving Consumer Goods (FMCG), also known as consumer packaged goods, are products that are sold quickly and at a relatively low cost. These companies are typically responsible for household-name branded goods and recruit large numbers of graduates. Their importance to the global economy means that this is traditionally one of the most sought-after sectors for graduate employment. Whether you're aiming for a career in a customer-facing role or a position in head office, the sector has plenty of opportunities, from dealing with dayto-day customer care and generating sales to influencing trends and making strategic business decisions. The four biggest retailers in the UK are Tesco, Sainsbury's, Walmart (Asda) and Morrisons meaning that supermarkets dominate the industry. There's a huge amount of competition for places on FMCG graduate schemes, so make you read up on advice to give yourself an edge in your applications and interviews.

## The impact of Covid-19

The pandemic and the resulting lack of footfall

caused a number of struggling retailers to fall into administration. Going forward, physical retailers need to continue to enforce current restrictions (such as limiting the number of customers in store and ensuring that shoppers wear face coverings) and deal with the challenges these bring.

Graduate vacancies have increased by 6.7% in consumer goods and decreased by 5.8% between 2019 and 2021. The latest recruitment targets for the country's leading employers suggest that the number of graduate jobs on offer in 2021 may increase, but there remains considerable uncertainty for graduate employers and the wider economy because of the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic.
